

Mary Reeves is the executive director of the Commission on English Language Program Accreditation (CEA), located in Alexandria, VA, USA. CEA is the US specialized accreditation agency that focuses on intensive English programs in higher education; it is recognized by the US Department of Education. Reeves has been in the IEP and international education field for 40 years, including as program director in both university and proprietary school settings. Reeves was on the original 1993 TESOL task force that studied the feasibility of establishing a specialized accreditor for the field. After CEA's founding, she served as an elected commissioner and then as commission chair in 2004. She has served as CEA's accreditation specialist, associate director, and now executive director since 2014. Reeves is a past president of EnglishUSA (formerly AAIEP, the US's largest IEP membership association) and former vice president of NAFSA's board of directors (the US association of international educators). She holds BA, MA, and MSE degrees, and a PhD in Educational Leadership and Policy Studies with a focus in international education policy.
