

Donald Staub began his position as an Assistant Professor in the department of Business and Management at Bandırma Onyedi Eylül in July, 2017. From 2011 to June, 2017, he was an assistant professor as well as the coordinator of the Quality Assurance Unit within the School of Foreign Languages at Işık University (Istanbul). Before moving to Turkey in 2011, Donald was the Director of Student Retention, while also overseeing the development and implementation of a college-wide outcomes assessment program at a U.S. college. Prior to that, he served as the director of the Office of Collaborative Education at Eastern Michigan University, and conducted his doctoral fellowship at the Institute for Education Reform. He is a Fulbright alumni and holds a doctorate in Educational Leadership from Eastern Michigan University; his MA and BA are from Michigan State University. While at Isik University, he led the development and implementation of the First Year Experience and Early Alert initiatives. His primary research interests lie in quality assurance in education; student retention, as well as design and implementation of programs for Social/Emotional Learning and Noncognitive Attributes within education systems (primary, secondary, & tertiary).
